

Alpines for the Enthusiast 2007 Plants available

- Androsace mariae* Wild coll Sichuan, Anyemaquan Shan, 4100m. This collection is from a dwarf form of this low mat / cushion forming plant. Pink flowers on short scapes. A really good plant. £4.00
- Androsace tangulashanensis* Wild coll Sichuan, Anyemaquan Shan, 4100m. Very tight cushion forming species (which reminds me of *A. tapete!*) Hopefully this will cover itself with flower as it does in the wild (white stemless) £4.00
- Aquilegia caerulea* var *ochroleuca* Utah, Six Mile Canyon, 10,600', limestone shale soils. First offering of this localised variant. The flowers are fully 4" across, completely white with orange anthers, facing slightly upwards. £2.00
- Aquilegia laramiense* Wild coll seed. Choice North American, creamy white flowers on stems to 12". Graceful plant for an open semi shaded position or scree. £2.50
- Campanula* 'Joe Elliott' A long standing and very good hybrid of *C. raineri*. Slowly creeps to form a dense mat adorned with numerous upfacing large blue cup shaped flowers in early summer £2.50
- Campanula finitima* In nature this grows in limestone or acid vertical rocks which gives a clue in where to grow it! Similar to *C. Betulaefolia*, larger and broader flowers. £2.00
- Campanula hercegovina nana* One of the choicest mid summer *Campanulas*. Mat forming and the ground hugging foliage explodes into masses of upward facing blue bells. For pot or trough. £3.00
- Campanula raineri* Italy, Paso Croce Domini, 2200m, limestone screes. Exquisite miniature species, covered in masses of upturned pale blue bells. Wild coll, no rogue garden imposters here! £2.50
- Corydalis schanginii* ssp *ainii* Finally a few to spare of this very special *Corydalis*. Yellow, black lipped flowers of large size early spring. One or two large tubers available, probably last offering for a while.... £10.00
- Corydalis solida* "Penza mixed" These are mixed plants from the Penza area of Russia, compact and very superior forms. Unpicked and some unflowered. The odd albino may appear. £2.50
- Dianthus brevicaulis* JJ 06-192 Turkey, Bolkar dag, 2600m, limestone crevices. Only introduced in the past few years and certainly one of the best for showing or outside in a raised bed. Somewhat variable but all forms flower well. £3.00
- Eritrichium aretioides* Montana, Teton Co, 7400'. American version of *E. nanum* and perhaps "easier!!". Will still tax the time and patience of the most adventurous. £4.00
- Gentiana szechenyi* Wild coll Sichuan, Chola Shan, 4300m. Whether this is *G. georgii* renamed or just a similar species, I'm not sure but it is growing quite well as a youngster! Expect large white to pale pink flowers. £4.00
- Hepatica japonica* By far the most variable and attractive race. These seedlings are from white, pink and blue forms often with contrasting anthers/pollen. All are absolutely wonderful. £2.50
- Iberis saxatilis* Coll Turkey, Kaz Dag, 1600m. A fantastic compact plant, ideal for a sink etc. Tufted mat with linear leaves and large white flowers. The best *Iberis*! £2.50
- Ipheion Alberto Castillo* An award of merit (2001) justly received in 2001. Proving quite hardy here with sumptuous large white flowers freely produced during the Spring period. £2.00
- Iris aff. uniflora* JJH colls This sp is largely unknown in cultivation and one or two spares from three Halda collections. Dwarf plants with violet, blue or lavender flowers. £3.50
- Iris* PC hybrids These are offered on a pot luck basis from a range of coloured forms. Amazing plants which are well suited to garden conditions and blooms over a long period. £2.00
- Iris tenax* NNS 04-424 Seed from USA but no field data. These plants are raised from a blue flowered race. Easy to grow and an ideal peat garden plant flowering in early summer. £2.50
- Meconopsis horridula* ssp *racemosa* Wild coll Sichuan, Daxue Shan, 4500m. Excellent dwarf species, limestone grower,

- glaucous green spiny flowers and short racemes bright blue flowers. £2.50
- Meconopsis lancifolia MP 06-496 Wild coll, Sichuan, Daxue Shan, 4300m. Very small plant with solitary blue or blue-violet flowers on stems 10-20cm tall. £2.50
- Meconopsis sp. MP 06-498 Wild coll Quinghai, Anyemaquen Shan, 5000m. Euroseeds collection and a very dwarf unidentified species here. Only 5-10cm tall in flower and very showy with in seed with dense spines. £2.50
- Phlox stansburyi Ca. Inyo Co. 7200'. A high desert dweller which is growing on quite nicely. The narrow tufts of foliage erupt with white, pink throated trumpets with unusally long tubes (3cm long). Choice new intro. £3.00
- Primula 'Broadwell Chamaeleon' Excellent and very scarce Joe Elliott raising. Flowers are pale purple or pink depending on age with a yellow eye. Very few! £3.00
- Primula 'Broadwell JoJo' From the "Broadwell" series and a perfect example of natures work (bee pollinated) Blue flowers with a white eye in profusion, ideal for pot/show work. £3.00
- Primula 'Broadwell Milkmaid' Just one or two spares of this scarce clone. Probably the most free flowering "white" in cultivation and worth any effort to establish. £5.00
- Primula 'Broadwell Oliver' One of the lesser known Broadwell clones but well worth growing. Thrum eyed flowers reddish lilac flowers with a white eye. Gives a good covering of flowers early spring. £3.00
- Primula 'Pink Aire' An early flowering clone with flowers that 'stay' much longer than most! The white blooms are tinged progressively deeper to the edge which is noticeably pink. £2.50
- Primula allionii "Anna Griffith" One of the older hybrids which remains one of the best! Sugar pink flowers in abundance early spring. £3.00
- Primula allionii "Archer" This is an excellent clone, free flowering and ideal for the showbench. Purple-pink flowers with a small white centre and thrum eyed. £3.50
- Primula allionii 'Eliza' This is one of the brightest shades of magenta yet raised. The neat well rounded pin eyed flowers are most eye catching. £3.50
- Primula allionii 'Eureka' Always scarce and certainly one of the most coveted P allionii forms. The large white flowers give complete coverage to the deep green cushion - a certain winner! £5.00
- Primula allionii 'Joanna' A Margaret Earle raising (HME 188.83). This is an easy going floriferous clone, thrum eyed lilac pink with a creamy green eye. £4.00
- Primula allionii 'Tranquillity' A reliable clone from Hartside, if you haven't got it you must!. Pale violet with a white eye - most aptly named. £3.00
- Primula 'Coolock Violet' A new release and my favourite offspring from 'Wharfedale Village'. The foliage is farinose and the flowers an eye-catching shade of violet borne in large umbels. Few £3.50
- Primula elatior ssp. meyeri Coll Turkey. Flower buds are now emerging as I write. Most appear blue but red purple forms not excluded £2.50
- Primula 'MariaTalbot' A very deep pink flowered hybrid Primula. The large flowers have notched petals and a hazy white 'star' at the centre £3.50
- Primula x allionii "Aire Mist" One of the best white flowered P. Allionii crosses (Allionii alba x Blairside yellow). A well flowered plant is a formality, a certain winner! £2.50
- Primula x allionii "Aire Waves" Yet another super little hybrid. Pure white flowers over tight hummock of foliage. For pot or maybe a trough with some protection. £3.00
- Primula x allionii "Clarence Elliot" Remains one of the best hybrids and virus free material offered. Free flowering in

mid spring with clear blue white eyed flowers.

Saxifraga 'Coolock Jean' A new cultivar raised here and this is a seedling from 'Kate'. The colour however is much different - opening deep pink then fading at the centre giving a 'two tone' effect. Stunning but very few.

Silene californica California, San Emigdo Mtn, 6500', gritty soil in shaded areas. Mat forming , blue green leaves in basal clusters. The flowers are vivid "fire engine" red on short stems.

Silene hookeri var *bolanderi* One plant I would not be without. These have flowered, the large pure white blooms deeply cut into linear segments. Once seen, immediately sought! Very few.

Silene kantzeensis JJ 05-104 China, Sichau, Kagding, 4300m. A new introduction, cushion forming in nature but making mats here. Large rose flowers according to the collection notes - sounds nice!
