Appeared Personally Benjamin Brown of No 157 Cannon Street in the City of London Merchant and made oath that he is one of the two subscribers to the last will and Testament now in force and in force of Susannah Bartrop formerly of parson place Newington in the County of Surry and late of Bishop Grove Newington in the County of Middlesex widow who died on or about the twentieth day of August last the said will bearing date the sixteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven and he further made oath that on the sixteenth day of July one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven the said testatrix duly executed and attested the said will by signing her name at the foot or end thereof in the presence of him the deponent and of Henry Thompson the other subscribed witness hereto both of whom present at the same time and this deponent and the said Henry Thompson heretofore attested and subscribed the said will in the presence of the said testatrix and of each other and referring to the letters or name "Bartrop" appearing to have been subsequently obliterated between the names "Susannah" and "Bartrop" the subscription of the said testatrix to the said will he further made oath that such letters or name "Bartrop" were written by the said testatrix at the time she executed the said will as part of her subscription hereto but that it being observed that a mistake had been committed in the spelling of her name she proceeded to obliterate the name as it now appears and immediately wrote the said name "Bartrop" as above subscribed the same in the presence of the said deponent and his said fellow witness and before them attested the execution of the said will - Ben^r Brown - on the 3rd day of October 1840 the said Benjamin Brown was duly sworn to the truth of this affidavit before me W C Curtis Sur^r at Test: J R Burchett J. together with the amount to be received under any assurance on my life or
affected in the annuity or any other assurance office and other property of what
nature or kind soever I give and bequeath the same and every part thereof
to my dear wife Mary Best to and for her sole use and benefit and I do hereby
appoint my dear wife executrix of this my will and I do hereby revoke all
former wills by me at any time heretofore made and declare this to be
my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my
