GOVAN OLD CHURCH

(St Constantine's)

By tradition the early medieval monastery at Govan was founded by St Constantine of Cornwall, King and Martyr. Recent historians prefer a later Constantine, Irish or Scottish.

The building is the fourth parish church set in the ancient graveyard, which some believe was used for pre-Christian worship. Robert Rowand Anderson modelled the church on c.13th lines, and it is regarded as one of the finest late c. 19th churches in Glasgow.

The fine collection of early medieval sculpture includes the Govan Sarcophagus, 5 hogback tombstones, the shaft of a Celtic Cross, the 'Sun stone' and other carved grave markers.

Beautiful stained glass windows were installed by Heaton, Butler & Bayne, Burlison & Grylls, Clayton & Bell and Shrigley & Hunt. The majority of stained glass, including the magnificent great east window, is by Charles E Kempe, and is among his earliest and best work in Scotland.

Among the men of faith and vision who have led the Christian community in Govan Parish were the Reformer Andrew Melville, the Covenanter Hugh Binning, the Moderate Matthew Leishman, the liturgical and theological pioneer John Macleod, and the founder of the Iona Community George MacLeod.
