

Bottrill

This is the last Will and Testament of me Matthew Bottrill of Monkgate in the Suburbs of the City of York Gentleman made the twenty first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven. I give and bequeath unto my Brother James Bottrill the Annuity or yearly sum of Fifty pounds during his life to be paid by equal quarterly payments in every year. The first payment thereof to be made at the end of three calendar months next after my decease. I give and bequeath unto my female servant Eleanor Brennard widow (if she shall be living with me at the time of my death). The Annuity or yearly sum of Fifty pounds during her life to be paid by equal quarterly payments in every year and the first payment thereof to be made at the end of three calendar months next after my decease and from and after the decease of the said Eleanor Brennard I give and bequeath the Annuity of yearly sum of thirty pounds unto her son James Brennard of the City of York Bookbinder (if he shall survive her) during his life to be paid by equal quarterly payments in every year the first payment thereof to be made at the end of three calendar months next after the decease of his said mother. I give and bequeath unto my man servant Richard Tesseyman (if he shall be living with me at the time of my death) the annuity or yearly sum of Twenty pounds during his life to be paid by equal quarterly payments in every year the first payment thereof to be made at the end of three calendar months next after my decease and I declare and direct that the said several annuities or yearly sums shall be issuing and payable out of and charged and chargeable upon all my Freehold and copyhold lands tenements hereditaments and real Estate situate at Osbaldwick and Huntington in the County of York and I invest the said annuitants respectively with such powers of distress and entry upon the said lands tenements hereditaments and real Estate and perception of the rents and benefits thereof (in case the said annuities or any of them or any part thereof respectively shall be in arrears) for recovering and compelling payment of the same respective annuities and all arrears thereof respectively as Landlords are entitled to for securing the payment of rents reserved on common demises and as one usually contained in grants of rent charges and subject and chargeable as aforesaid I give and devise all my said Lands tenements hereditaments and real estate situate at Osbaldwick and Huntington as aforesaid unto my Great nephew George Hudson of Goodramgate in the city or York Mercer his heirs and assigns for ever. I give and bequeath to my nieces Harriet the wife of Thomas Atkinson of Kilham Surgeon and Ann the wife of Thomas Atkinson of Beverley aforesaid Gentleman the sum of Five hundred pounds apiece. To my nephews John Catton and Robert Catton son of my late sister Mary the sum of Five hundred pounds apiece, to my nephew James Flint

the son of my sister Elizabeth the sum of Five hundred pounds to my sister Frances the wife of John Flint the sum of five hundred pounds to my nephews George Blanchard and Nathaniel Blanchard sons of my sister Margaret the sum of Five hundred pounds apiece, to my Nieces Mary Ruston and Ann Ruston the daughters of my late sister Ann the sum of Five hundred pounds, to be equally divided between them all which had several legacies hereinbefore bequeathed I direct shall be paid to the respective Legatees thereof within twelve calendar months next after my decease I give and bequeath to Richard the son of the said George Hudson my gold Watch, to the said Eleanor Rennard the Clothes and wearing apparel of my late wife and the small silver cup which she commonly used, to the said Richard Tesseyman, my own clothes and Wearing apparel and the silver pint which I commonly use. I give to the Churchwardens and Overseers of the poor of the Parish of Bugthorpe (where I was born) the sum of Ten pounds to be distributed in money amongst such of the poor inhabitants residing therein as the said Churchwardens and Overseers shall deem the most deserving objects of charity I direct that the Servants who shall be living with me at the time of my decease shall be respectively provided with a decent suit of mourning by my executor hereinafter named and that he shall pay to each of the same Servants immediately upon my decease the whole of his or her wages for the then current years Service. I give and devise all the residue and remainder of my Freehold and copyhold messuages lands tenements hereditaments and real estate whatsoever and wheresoever not hereinbefore specifically disposed of and also all my personal Estate and Effects whatsoever not hereinbefore specifically bequeathed unto the said George Hudson his heirs Executors administrators and assigns respectively according to the nature of the same Estates respectively subject nevertheless to and charged and chargeable with the payment of my just debts funeral and testamentary expences and the pecuniary legacies hereinbefore bequeathed or which I may bequeath by any codicil to this my Will and I appoint the said George Hudson sole executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me at any time made In Witness whereof I the said Matthew Bottrill the Testator have to the two first sheets of this my last Will and Testament and my hand to this third and last sheet thereof my hand and seal the day and year first herein written Mattw Bottrill, Signed sealed published and declared by the above named Matthew Bottrill the Testator as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in his presence have hereunto subscribed our names as Witnesses.
